THE GOOD FIGHT THAT DIDN'T END

The letters, journals, and newspaper writings of Henry Perkins Goddard (1842-1916) of Norwich, Connecticut, provide much firsthand detail about the passions and principles of a divided nation during the Civil War and Reconstruction as witnessed by a scrupulous soldier and scribe eager to capture the bitter realities of his time.

We welcome his great-grandson, Calvin Goddard Zon, who will be recounting these details of combat in the battles of Antietam, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, and Gettysburg, travels across the war-torn South after the war, and encounters and friendships with well-known historical and literary figures of the era, including Abraham Lincoln, Ulysses S. Grant, George McClellan, Ambrose Burnside, Joseph Hooker, George Armstrong Custer, Harriet Beecher Stowe, and Mark Twain.
